- Feature writing offers a fresh viewpoint and a closer examination of subjects, characters, or events. Similar to investigative journalism, it aims to unearth fresh data, but its primary focus is on supplying additional information rather than responding to inquiries.

- The writer's personal opinions are expressed in the columns. In addition to entertaining and persuading readers, they occasionally aim to stir up controversy and spark debate.
- *Reviews give an objective description of a topic before offering the author's personal viewpoint. When they are printed in news outlets, they frequently discuss novels or television shows.
